Dear Friends.

If 2020 was the year of the cocoon, for Michigan CASA, 2021 was the year of the butterfly. We emerged from the pandemic stronger, more vibrant, more prepared to stretch our wings and fly forward.

Supportive state legislators saw to it that Michigan CASA received State funding sufficient to pass through almost 70% of those funds to support existing local CASA programs, many of which lost federal funding due to cuts. This funding also enabled us to increase by 12% the number of children we serve, and to recruit and train 24% more volunteers.

And while our own transformation has been invigorating, it pales in comparison to the transformations we saw among the 1328 children who were matched to a CASA volunteer in 2021. Once removed from an abusive environment and paired with a caring volunteer, these children began to blossom, to participate in their classrooms, and to build trusting relationships with their foster parents, teachers and peers. They too are unfolding their wings and preparing to explore a new, more vibrant environment.

I'm so grateful for those state legislators, our board, our staff, our local program directors and their staff and so many others. And as always, I am grateful to the 799 individuals who, every year, volunteer to be an advocate for a child who needs them. They are heroes.





Program Service Facts

Changes in Number of Total Children Served:

• 12% increase in the number of children we served since 2020.

Changes in Number of Total Volunteers and Volunteer Hours:

- 24% increase in the reported number of total volunteers since 2020
- 31% increase in the reported number of volunteer hours contributed since 2020
- Forty-four percent of volunteers were employed full-time or part-time outside of their CASA volunteering.

Placement Types:

In 2021, there were 1,064 children placed in out-of-home care. Of these children, 31% were placed with a relative and 53% with a non-relative foster parent.

Children Involved in Closed Cases:

Most common final outcomes for children involved in cases closed in 2021 were reunification with their family (44%) or adoption (26%).

Time in Out-of-Home Care for Cases Closed:

Sixty-four percent of children served whose cases closed spent between 6 and 29 months in out-of-home care, with 34% spending between 12 and 23 months.





Future Growth



Michigan CASA is focusing its growth activities in the southeast Michigan counties of Macomb (unserved), Wayne (grossly underserved), and Oakland (underserved) along with the southwest counties of Berrien and Cass counties (underserved) and VanBuren county (unserved). Between these 6 counties there are 4,796 eligible children, of which only 448 are currently being served. This represents just 10% of the children in this six county region. If all of the children in these regions were to be served, the overall state average would increase to 43%.
